# Competition General Rules 2021-2022

- Parkland Horseman's Association (PHA) uses the guidelines of the current United States Equestrian Federation (USEF), United States Dressage Federation (USDF) and American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA) Rule Books as its own, except where it conflicts with the rules herein. The show's board members will decide any questions not covered by the USEF, USDF, and AQHA rule books.
- 2) Equine Zero Liability: Florida Senate Bill 1658 Equine Zero Liability applies: Warning under Florida Law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for injury to, or death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities. PHA is not liable for any accident, loss, damage or injury sustained by any exhibitor, trainer, owner, agent, groom, spectator, individual or horse while at the PHA Show. This is incorporated as a condition of entry or admittance to the PHA Horse Shows.
- 3) Signed entry forms shall be deemed as acceptance of the conditions named. In the event an entry form is not signed or presented, being present on the grounds or at the arena as an exhibitor, trainer, owner, spectator or consignor shall be deemed to be acceptance of these conditions.
- 4) Sportsmanship: All members of PHA, including family and friends of riders or handlers, will be expected to display good sportsmanship behaviors, both in the arena and out of it, including all social media forums. Any unsportsmanlike behaviors are to be documented and reported to any board member at any time. All reports will be investigated by the Board and appropriate disciplinary action will ensue. This includes for a first offense: verbal or written warning; second: non-eligibility for Year-End awards; third: their suspension for the remainder of the season.
- 5) Code of Conduct: PHA reserves the right to disqualify and expel any exhibitor, handler, or trainer from the grounds for any cruel or inhumane treatment of any animal. No fees will be refunded.
- 6) Weather: Inclement weather or lack of projected participation may result in cancellation of a show at the discretion of the Show Committee. Time and date of make-up show, if any, will be made at the next regular Board meeting or at a special meeting of the Board.
- 7) Membership: Riders, Owners, Trainers and Volunteers MUST ALL be members of PHA. The membership form serves as a liability agreement for PHA and the City of Parkland. Members must fill out and sign their own membership form, not their trainer. Riders 18 and under need the signature of parent or guardian. All memberships must be completed online.
  - a) Individual/Trainer Membership: \$35.
  - b) Family membership: \$50.
  - c) Non-Competing Membership: \$25.
  - d) Single Day: \$25.
  - e) Volunteer (ONLY) Membership: \$0
- 8) Coggins: A current NEGATIVE coggins test must be provided at first show and if renewed during show year. Name of horse on show forms may be registered or barn name, but must match negative Coggins test, and remain the same for circuit year. Changing during the year may result in loss of year end points.

- 9) The age and name of an exhibitor and horse on the date of the first show is their age and name for the entire year. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to see that the points keeper has their correct age, name, and name of horse.
- 10) Entering a competition: Names on entry forms for both horse and exhibitor must remain the same for the whole show circuit. Entry forms MUST be completed online by the exhibitor. If the exhibitor is under the age of 18, a parent or legal guardian must complete the entries online on behalf of the exhibitor. Entry forms MUST be completed online. Please see rules of the competition for entry fees and closing dates.
  - a) PHA reserves the right to add or cancel a class should it be in the best interest of the show.
  - b) Canceled classes will not count toward year end awards.
  - c) In the event a class is canceled by show officials, credit will be given for a class to be used at any show during the circuit year. No refunds will be given.
  - d) No refunds or credit for missed classes.
  - e) All entries must be paid by cash, check, PayPal or Venmo (@parklandhorsemans) before or on the day of the show.
  - f) There is a \$35 fee for returned checks. No exhibitor will accumulate points while their show fees are in arrears. Points will accumulate from the date show fees are paid.
  - g) Entry scratches must be made directly with the show secretary or at the show office on the day of the show. Refunds or credits may be considered if the show committee is presented with a vet or doctor's note.
  - h) Riders can register the day of the Obstacle challenge and Introductory Hunters/Jumpers, although pre-registration is greatly appreciated. Dressage entries must pre-register.
  - All protests submitted to the show management or club officer by any member must be accompanied by a \$25 fee. Such a fee will be refunded only if the protest is upheld in favor of the member submitting the protest. All protests must be submitted in writing, dated, and signed.
- 11) Judge's Decisions: Judge's decisions are final.
  - a) Any act of discourtesy to any judge or show official by any owner, trainer, rider or groom constitutes grounds for disqualification of any horse(s) owned, trained, ridden or groomed by the aforementioned individual. Owner will forfeit all fees for the show.
  - b) Judges may deem a horse unsound and may eliminate said horse at their discretion.
- 12) Under no circumstances will an exhibitor under the age of 18 be allowed to show and/or handle a stallion on the show grounds. This includes lead-line, in-hand and miniature horses. Unruly horses or horses deemed unsafe by the judge or board members may be asked to leave the show grounds.
- 13) Attire: SEI approved helmets are required for all riders under the age of 18 while mounted at the show grounds. Please see the rules for your chosen competition for attire specifics.
- 14) Daily awards: 1st through 6th place ribbons will be awarded. Other awards may be offered at the discretion of the show committee. Please refer to each respective discipline rules for information about scoring.

- 15) Year-End awards: Riders must complete 6 hours of volunteer time. Volunteer time may be accrued at any PHA event and performed by family members. 3 hours may be purchased for \$20 per hour. Attending monthly Board Meeting counts as 1 hour. Exhibitor is responsible for making sure his/her hours are recorded in the Volunteer Hour Record Book. All horse/rider combinations must have competed in one more than half the shows held during the competition year. Please refer to each respective discipline rules for information about scoring.
- 16) Children must be monitored at all times.
- 17) For the safety of all concerned, all pets must be leashed or tied and under control at all times.
- 18) Lunging in designated areas only.
- 19) Alcoholic drinks are prohibited.
- 20) PHA reserves the right to refuse any entry at the show and can eliminate any exhibitor or horse from further competition if the best interest of the show is to be served.

### Dressage

#### 2021-2022 Rules and Information

PHA is proud to offer a friendly and easy-going opportunity to compete in the sport of Dressage. We hope that our low-stress environment gives riders a place to test themselves and their horses, and to prepare for larger competitions. Our PHA Lead-Line tests are a unique way to introduce young riders to the dressage arena and showing.

Please read the PHA General Rules

- 1. All tests are current USEF, FEI, and WDAA tests unless otherwise stated. Find our PHA Lead-Line tests in our Show Book or contact a Board Member for a copy.
- 2. Riders MUST preregister. Entry forms MUST be filled out in their entirely and accompanied by a current copy of a negative Coggins test and full payment.
- 3. Only one Horse/Rider combination per form. The horse's name must match the name on the Coggins test.
- 4. Each horse may compete in a maximum of 3 tests, with the exception of leadline classes.
- 5. Closing date for registration is 7 days before the show. Late entries are subject to a \$10 late fee and may be accepted at the discretion of the Show Secretary.
- 6. All entries must be completed online.
- Fees for classes scratched after the closing date will become a donation to PHA. Refunds after the closing date may be considered with a request accompanied with a doctor's or veterinarian's note.
- 8. Ride times will be available after 7:00 pm the Wednesday before the show.
- 9. Attire: SEI approved helmets are mandatory for all English riders. Hunter attire or a sleeved, collared shirt with boots, breeches and a belt is required for English riders. For Western riders, a collared shirt with sleeves, boots, long pants and a Western hat or helmet are required.
- 10. Introductory Level Novice classes are open to first year competitors only.
- 11. Lead-Line riders are not permitted to compete in any other classes on that day.
- 12. Daily Award: 1st through 6th place ribbons will be awarded for each class. A Level Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded for divisions with a minimum of 2 rider/horse combinations. Level Champion ribbon will be awarded to the horse/rider with the highest average score of that level (must have 2 score minimum). Level Reserve Champion goes to the second highest average score.
- 13. Year-End Awards: Each rider must have shown in one more than half the shows and completed a minimum of 6 volunteer hours in order to qualify for year-end awards. Champion and Reserve prizes and Champion, Reserve, and 3rd through 6th place ribbons will be awarded for each level. Please see PHA General Rules for more specifics to qualify.
- 14. Hors Concours: Hors Concours rides are to be ridden at the end of each show, following all of the competitive rides. Scores are provided at the discretion of the judge and will not count towards or are included in the competition.
- 15. Ride-A-Test: At the discretion of the judge, Ride-A-Test may be available at some shows.





### Introductory Hunters and Jumpers

#### 2021-2022 Rules and Information

Parkland Horseman's Association (PHA) offers a variety of entry level Hunter and Jumper classes to engage those riders who are looking for experience in competition. Our friendly environment is ideal to develop confidence for both riders and horses. Hunter classes run on Saturdays with the first schooling opening at 8:00 AM and the show beginning at 9:00 AM. Jumper classes will start no earlier than 12 PM.

- 1) All riders will be issued a back number. Exhibitors must be wearing a back number and a helmet whenever mounted.
- 2) A rider with three refusals will be excused from the class.
- 3) The judge/show director has the right to excuse any rider who displays unsportsmanlike conduct or what the judge/show director deems to be dangerous activity.
- 4) There is to be a maximum of 10 riders in the schooling area at one time.
- 5) For Divisions 100-500 These Riders may NOT cross enter into ANY other HUNTER division or class on any horse. They may however ride more than one horse in the same division or show in the JUMPER divisions. The HORSE may cross enter into another division with a different rider.
- 6) For Divisions 600-700 The horse/ rider combination cannot cross enter into any other HUNTER division. However, the horse or rider may independently show in another division and the combo may enter into any Jumper division.
- 7) Divisions may be combined at the request of the judge/steward if there are fewer than 3 participants in the division.
- 8) Ties for Hunter Champion and/ or Reserve points are decided by points earned in the over fences class.
- 9) Please see General Rules for information on PHA competitions, awards, and qualifications required for Year End Awards.
- 10) Daily awards: Classes will be placed with 1st-6th place ribbons. If there are 3 or more participants in a division, grand and reserve prize/trophy may be available the day of show. Prizes and ribbons must be collected the day of the show.
  - a) Points are as follows and are based on the number of participants in the class. (eg, if there are 3 participants, 1st place will get 3 points)
    - i) 1st place up to 6 points
    - ii) 2nd place up to 5 points
    - iii) 3rd place up to 4 points
    - iv) 4th place up to 3 points
    - v) 5th place up to 2 points
    - vi) 6th place up to 1 point

- 11) Year End Awards: Year-End Points are added up by division and 1st 6th place is awarded for each division. A rider must have competed in a minimum of one more than half of the shows to qualify for Year End Awards. For Divisions 100-500 the points will be accumulated by the rider and having different horse entries throughout the show will NOT impact score. For Divisions 600-800 the points are calculated as a horse / rider combination and therefore the combination must have shown at one more than half of competitions to qualify.
  - a) Year-end high points will be determined by the following:
    - i) 1st place up to 6 points
    - ii) 2nd place up to 5 points
    - iii) 3rd place up to 4 points
    - iv) 4th place up to 3 points
    - v) 5th place up to 2 points
    - vi) 6th place up to 1 points
  - b) Points are based on the number of participants in the class. (eg, if there are 3 participants, 1st place will get 3 points)
  - c) Highest number of points will determine Champion and 2nd highest will determine Reserve Champion. Please see general rules to be sure to qualify for year-end awards.

12) Requests can be made with the Hunter/Jumper entries for an exception to the requirement of USEF approved equipment, bits, and/or protective boots/wraps if necessary for the safety of the horse and/or rider.

#### 100: BEGINNER LEADLINE- (Walk Only)

For Riders learning to balance and two point.

Beginner Leadline rider must be 10 & under and accompanied by an adult 18+. These Riders may NOT cross enter into ANY other division or class on any horse.

- 101. Leadline Walk Equitation
- 102. Leadline Walk Ground Pole (Left)
- 103. Leadline Walk Ground Pole (Right)

#### 200: ADVANCED LEADLINE- (Walk/ Trot)

For Riders learning to post, steer, and two point.

Advanced Leadline riders must be 12 & under accompanied by an adult 18+. The horse may be led on a lead or off lead with the adult accompanying alongside the rider. The rider will be asked to walk over a pole in one class and trot over in another class. These Riders may NOT cross enter into ANY other division or class on any horse.

- 201. Advanced Leadline -Walk/ Trot Equitation
- 202. Advanced Leadline- Walk Ground Pole (Left)
- 203. Advanced Leadline- Trot Ground Pole (Right)

#### 300: BEGINNER CROSSRAILS (Walk/Trot) (1 Jump)

For Riders independently able to post, steer, and two point at the trot. Walk Trot Beginner X-Rail will ride as a group in the equitation on the flat however will jump each direction one at a time. These Riders may NOT cross enter into ANY other HUNTER division or class on any horse.

- 301. Beginner X-rails Equitation Flat
- 302. Beginner X-rails O/F (Single X-Rail tracking Left)
- 303. Beginner X-Rails O/F (Single X-Rail tracking Right)

#### 400: ADVANCED CROSSRAILS- (Walk/Trot/Canter) (4 Jumps)

For Riders who are ready to start putting together multiple jumps.

Walk Trot Canter riders will walk and trot together as a group on the flat. These Riders may NOT cross enter into ANY other HUNTER division or class on any horse. Riders are able to trot or canter the jumps without penalty. Consistency in gait is rewarded.

- 401. Advanced X-Rails Equitation Flat
- 402. Advanced X-Rails (Tracking Left)
- 403. Advanced X-Rails (Tracking Right)

#### 500: SHORT STIRRUP

For Riders under 18 ready to start putting together a full course of 5-6 Jumps with a max height of 2'. The rider horse combination cannot cross enter into any other Hunter division.

# **Obstacle Challenge**

#### 2021-2022 Rules and Information

PHA's Obstacle Challenge is a fun and easy introduction to obstacle events that follow AQHA guidelines. The events are judged, untimed and open to any discipline. This is a family friendly way to better your horsemanship and strengthen the bond with your equine partner. Expect the obstacles to be similar to those found in a variety of trail type classes.

- 1) Please read the PHA General Rules and Obstacles Class Guide. Any challenges, please ask the Obstacle Chair IN WRITING as they have the final decision.
- 2) All participants must be a member of PHA in good standing.
- 3) All participants must present a current copy of a negative Coggins test and the horse's name must match the one on the entry form.
- 4) One horse and rider/handler combination per entry form. Entry forms are available online and will be provided the morning of competition. Adding classes and additional runs are allowed the morning of the competition.
- 5) Entry forms are available online and pre-entry is encouraged. Entries will be accepted the day of the show up until the start of the class you are entering.
- 6) Show attire for your respective discipline is encouraged. SEI approved helmets are mandatory for all riders/handlers under the age of 18 and encouraged for all participants. Long pants, boots, belt, and a sleeved, collared shirt are required. No tank tops.
- 7) After registering, riders/handlers will receive a back number and their score sheet will be given to the scribe to hold. Participants are responsible for making sure the correct back number and class is listed on their score sheets.
- 8) 17 and Under, Adult and Open classes will have 2+ more obstacles than the Lead-line, 10 and Under and Novice classes. Open classes may be asked to trot or canter between obstacles.
- 9) A walk-through is available ½ hour before the start of the show. 15 min before the first class there will be a guided walkthrough with the judge and director for everyone's advantage and will not be repeated for those not present. No horses are allowed on the course until competition begins. No mounted horses on course until the completion of the in-hand classes.
- 10) The show will start promptly at the time specified. Classes are run in number order starting with inhand. Any competitors cross-entering from the Hunter/Jumper ring will be able to run out of order. Please contact the gatekeeper on the day of the show to coordinate.
- 11) Be courteous at the in-gate. Do not crowd other participants and work together to help keep the show flowing. Please be ready at the in-gate at the start of your class. Classes will not be held for late arrivals. If you are not present at the in-gate when your class is called, you will be disqualified.
- 12) Only one horse and rider/handler permitted on the course at a time except for lead-line classes and during open-schooling during the first break (max 6 horses at a time during open schooling).

#### 13) Fees:

- a) Obstacle/office fee \$10
- b) Class fee \$15
- c) Open Schooling fee \$10 (Open schooling will be during the first break between the In-hand and under-saddle classes)
- d) Unjudged runs \$10 each (Unjudged runs will be at the conclusion of the show)
- 14) The course must be performed as shown in the course diagram/walkthrough the day of the show.
- 15) Scoring is determined by 0-10 points awarded per obstacle, then 0-10 points awarded for Equitation, and another 0-10 for Partnership. Please see judge's guidelines for an explanation of what is expected. The points will be compiled, and the highest number points determine class placings. Ties will be broken by the partnership score. If that is the same, then the judge decides placings.
- 16) No more than 3 attempts at an obstacle are allowed, after 3 attempts and 3 refusals, the horse/rider must move on to the next obstacle and will receive a score of '0' for the obstacle. The judge may excuse a participant for anything deemed unsafe or abusive and disqualify the horse/rider.
- 17) Horses entered in leadline under saddle class have the option of doing an unjudged, in-hand runthrough prior to the lead-line under saddle class. Lead-line competitors may not cross enter into any other under saddle classes.
- 18) Daily awards: Classes will be placed with 1st-6th place ribbons. If there are 3 or more participants in a class, 1st place prize/trophy may be available the day of show. Prizes and ribbons must be collected the day of the show.
- 19) Year-end Awards: Year-end high points will be determined by the following:
  - a) 1st place up to 6 points
  - b) 2nd place up to 5 points
  - c) 3rd place up to 4 points
  - d) 4th place up to 3 points
  - e) 5th place up to 2 points
  - f) 6th place up to 1 point

Points are based on the number of participants in the class. (eg, if there are 3 participants, 1st place will get 3 points) Highest number of points will determine Champion and 2nd highest will determine Reserve Champion. Please see general rules to be sure to qualify for year-end awards.

#### General Class Guidelines

In-hand:

- In-hand classes are to be performed in a halter (flat, rope or show halters acceptable) or English bridle with lead (reins may be left on the bridle but shall be secured)
- Horse may have saddle on
- Physical aids may only be used in the Novice Classes. (whips, lead ropes, hand, etc..) Hands should be on the lead rope at all times unless using the hand to handle a portion of the obstacle.

#### Lead-Line:

• Leadline can be done with a handler walking beside the rider or with a leadline attached. The rider should be able to exhibit the ability to stop and turn their horse.

#### Under Saddle:

- Tack may be English or Western (training or show tack)
- Physical aids may only be used in the Novice Classes. (whips, reins, hand, etc..) Spurs are acceptable at all levels.
- Bits and rein usage is per AQHA regulations (two hands are acceptable depending on bit used with the exception of when you use your hand to perform an obstacle)

#### Scoring

#### Equitation score:

Handlers will position themselves safely at the side of the horse and hold lead correctly.
 Riders will demonstrate correct rider position. Both handlers and riders will be scored on effective use of the aids.

#### Partnership score:

 Handlers and riders that are in tune with their horse and communicate seamlessly, and horses that look to their handler for direction with confident obedience, will be rewarded. Handlers will lose points for: sharp corrections with the lead, touching the horse to guide ("Good Boy" rubs/pats allowed between obstacles), yelling, hindering the horse in any way and placing him or herself in the path of the horse. Riders will lose points for: excessive use of aids, loss of control, misguiding horse through obstacle, and misinterpretation of obstacle.

#### Presentation score:

- The horse is groomed appropriately and displays health and good care. Handler/rider is dressed to match tack. Tack is clean, well-cared for, fits correctly, and is consistent.
- Leg/hoof protection is acceptable

Judge's decisions are final, and a competitor may be eliminated for any unsafe situation, including dangerous behavior or equipment and any sign of abusive practices. Competitors will not be eliminated for going off course, but 10 points will be deducted from final score as well as points lost for any obstacles not executed.

#### Examples of Possible Obstacles (and How to Execute):

#### Canopies:

- Enter straight with no hesitation, maintaining careful rhythm.
- Obvious rushing will result in lower score.

#### Backing:

- Stride carefully but purposefully.
- Straight, pivots may be required.

#### Gate:

٠

Approach and line up easily, maneuver handily through gate, and close with no resistance.

#### Bridge and tarps:

• Enter straight and cross with deliberate careful smooth steps.

#### Weaving:

• Flex through, with efficient strides, and show correct bend.

#### Ground Poles:

- Horses must step over each pole.
- Points are taken off for moving or nicking the poles.

#### Mailbox:

• Approach with confidence and stand quietly with loose lead or rein and move off with minimal cue from rider/handler.

#### Car wash:

- Enter straight and step through with confidence, maintaining rhythm.
- Obvious rushing will result in lower score.

#### Moving objects on course:

- Object movements can be done exaggerated or minimal.
- Each will be judged accordingly.
